## Lorena Salas Named Principal of Union Park Elementary



**DENTON ISD, TX** - Lorena Salas, principal of Alexander Elementary School since 2013, has been named the principal of Union Park Elementary School. The district's 24th primary school is located in a 1,100-acre master planned community, Union Park, in Little Elm with frontage on US Highway 380, directly across the street from Braswell High School.

"I'm honored to serve the community and students of Union Park attendance zone," said Ms. Salas. "I look forward to meeting our

families that we will partner with to make the community a wonderful place to live and learn."

Ms. Salas is a veteran educator with 23 years of experience, and 12 of those as a campus administrator.

In 1996, Ms. Sala served as a second-grade teacher for five years in Lewisville ISD before joining Denton ISD in 2001. She taught second and third grades at Wilson Elementary for four years before becoming a campus Bi-lingual/ESL Coordinator.

In 2007, Ms. Salas was named the assistant principal at Wilson Elementary where she served for six years before moving to W.S. Ryan Elementary as the assistant principal. She was named principal of Alexander Elementary in 2013, a campus recently renamed for Alice Moore Alexander, a pioneer of educational equality in

the Denton community.

In her spare time, Ms. Salas served as an adjunct professor at the University of North Texas in the Bi-lingual/ESL Department from 2009-2012.

"I am excited to have the opportunity to work alongside Ms. Salas," said Jeff Russell, area superintendent of academic programs. "She brings a wealth of experience and a proven track record of academic achievement that will set a tone of excellence at our newest campus."

Ms. Salas earned her bachelor's and master's degrees from the Texas Woman's University with a focus on literacy instruction.

Union Park Elementary is located on the western side of Union Park-Phase 4, near Bryan Road and Union Park Blvd., and will be built in the fashion of the district's prototype element-

## Denton County Road and Bridge Updates

From the Desk of Hugh Coleman



**Regional road and bridge updates:**

**FM 720 North** - In May, the contractor will construct concrete sidewalks, lay asphalt, install concrete driveways and install seed/sod for northbound FM 720 lanes.

**FM 455** - From west of FM 2450 to east of Marion Road, 30 percent plans are expected in early May. Illumination throughout the corridor is under discussion.

**Mayhill Road** - From north of Quail Creek Road to U.S. 380, old poles have been removed. Additional utility re-located needed at the U.S. 380

intersection are underway. I-35E/Loop 288/Brinker/Mayhill - A new southbound exit ramp opened on April 9. Crews are constructing retaining walls and an entrance ramp as well as handling Brinker bridge drill shafts, Loop 288 drill shafts and the southbound main lane embankment.

Union Hill/ FM 455/ FM 2164 Realignment Project - For May, the focus will be on vegetation.

U.S. 380 East - (Loop 288 to U.S. 377) The TxDOT design team is working on 95 percent plans with an estimated timeline for submittal of May 2019. (U.S. 377 to county line) The consultant continues to work on the 95 percent plans. The estimated timeline for submittal is July 2019.

**DENTON COUNTY, TX** - Severe weather season is upon us! Denton has already had one confirmed tornado that took out many mature trees. Hopefully, we won't have anymore of that, however, it's likely that we will still see hail storms, high winds and possibly more flooding. Although severe weather is unpredictable, there are steps you can take to assist in the recovery



of your landscape and possibly prevent future issues. Let's talk tree damage.

Trees should never be topped. You may hear that you need to reduce the length or weight of branches to prevent future storm damage, but topping destroys the structure of the tree and makes it weaker and more vulnerable. After pruning

out the broken branches, your tree may look unbalanced or strange, but give it a little time to recover before doing any more pruning. As a general rule of thumb, you don't want to remove more than one-third of a tree at a time. Of course, if more than one-third has been damaged, you have no choice.

**DENTON, TX** - On May 1, the City of Denton entered Risk Level 2 - Enhanced Response of the Mosquito Surveillance and Response Plan. Typically, Risk Level 2

is triggered before the mosquito season is underway and centers on activities citizens can do to help the City control the mosquito population. At this Risk Level, the probability of human outbreak of the West Nile virus is low. Strategies for protecting human health and methods for minimizing mosquito populations are the main control measures emphasized under Risk Level 2.

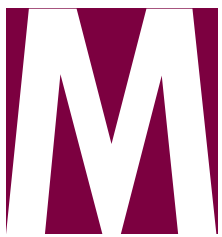

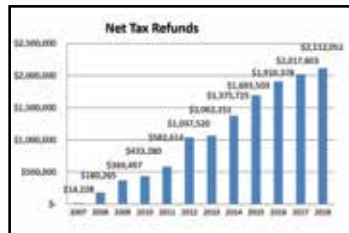

## \$2.1M Back to Taxpayers Thanks to United Way of Denton County's VITA

Nearly two thousand volunteer hours resulted in 11th consecutive year of growth for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program assisting Denton County low to moderate income taxpayers



DENTON, TX – United Way of Denton County announced the 11th consecutive year of return growth for the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program for tax year 2018 with 1,552 returns filed with tax credits totaling \$2.1 million for hard-working Denton County taxpayers.

Seventy volunteers committed a total of 1,956 hours for training, client intake, and tax preparation to help neighbors earning no more than \$58,000 file their federal income taxes accurately and for free at nine sites located across Denton County in the following mu-

nicipalities: Corinth, Denton, Lake Dallas, Lewisville, Little Elm, Pilot Point, and Sanger.

“These volunteers are the backbone of VITA,” said Gary Henderson, President and CEO of United Way of Denton County. “Their hard work and dedication saved Denton County taxpayers an estimated \$420,000 in unnecessary filing fees while returning over \$2 million back to the Denton County economy.”

VITA serves the gamut of clients from students, to struggling families with children, to seniors. Clients over age 60 saw a 53% increase in returns filed in just two years.

“We get lots of widows coming in who for the very first time in their life have to deal with taxes by themselves,” shared VITA volunteer John Hoose. “I’m just happy we’re there to help them.”

The VITA program, created by the IRS and implemented by United Way of Denton County, has shown steady growth since filing 28 returns for \$14,228 in refunds for the 2007 tax year.

## African Swine Fever – A Global Issue



Denton, TX – African Swine Fever (ASF) is a viral disease that affects swine of all ages. Recently news broke that the disease had infected pigs in Japan and other Asian countries. ASF is highly contagious to all swine. Symptoms include high fever, decreased appetite and skin lesions. Mortality rate is close to 100% within 2-10 days.

ASF is not a threat to human health and cannot be transmitted to humans. That’s the good part! The bad part is that China has already lost 25% of their swine herd. To put a number on that, they have already culled 1,000,000 pigs to try and control the disease. That will have a huge global impact on protein markets. One bank has already predicted a ten million ton gap in product compared to demand.

The disease is not a public health threat because it only affects swine. It is a non-threat to non-swine pets and other livestock. The USDA has pre-

ventative measures to keep sick animals from entering the food supply or the country in general. Recently one million pounds of illegal products containing pork was confiscated in New York by the Customs and Border Protection. The National Pork Producers Council recently cancelled the annual World Pork Expo in Des Moines, Iowa due to concerns about the disease.

History  
ASF was identified in Africa around 1920. It has jumped from country to country since then. In the last two years it has been found in China, Mongolia, Vietnam and most recently Japan. There is no known treatment or vaccination for the disease, the best control is to reduce the spread of the disease by depopulation of infected animals. There has been some work to develop a vaccine in the last 20 years but that work was slowed by a lack of funding in 2004. Recently, the Department of Homeland Security has revived the research.

Reporting the Disease  
If you have pigs here are signs you should be familiar with related to ASF:

- High fever
- Decreased appetite and weakness
- Red blotchy skin lesions
- Diarrhea and vomiting
- Coughing

Producers need to immediately report animals that could be affected by alerting state and federal officials. USDA has a toll free number at 1-866-536-7593.

Travelers on Alert  
International travelers could unknowingly bring ASF in from an affected country, especially if farm visits are made. You can visit the Animal Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) traveler page to identify items you can bring back to the US without threat of the disease. The key is to declare any international farm visits to US Customs and Border Protection when you return.

Just because a tree has suffered storm damage does not necessarily mean that it is a goner. Trees can experience a lot of defoliation or leaf loss and recover. However, you should remove broken branches and limbs. Trimming and pruning trees takes some skill and may be dangerous, so consider hiring a professional to help you.

As with hiring any professionals, use caution. Certified arborists are specifically trained in tree care and have passed a certification exam. They also are required to re-

ceive continuing education credits to ensure they are up to date with the latest information and techniques. The International Society of Arboriculture webpage (<http://www.treesaregood.org/>) has a link to “find an arborist” by entering your zip code. There are also many competent and conscientious landscapers, who while not certified arborists, can provide you with excellent service. In short, just because someone has a chainsaw, doesn’t mean they know what they are doing.

In this age of do-it-yourself,

here are some pointers (which will also help gauge if you are hiring someone knowledgeable). Smaller limbs can be trimmed back to where there is no damage or to a larger branch. Larger branches may need to be removed completely, meaning trimmed back to the trunk.

When removing larger branches, the weight of the limb itself can strip the bark when being cut. We recommend using the three-cut method. The first step is to make a partial cut from beneath, at a point several inches away from the trunk.

Next, make a second cut from above several inches out from the first cut, which will remove the branch. This double cut method prevents the weight of the branch from tearing the bark. And finally, complete the job with a final cut just outside the branch collar, the raised area that surrounds the branch where it joins the trunk. You always want to leave a branch collar. You do not want a flush pruning cut. The Texas Forest Service has excellent information on pruning trees with illustrations. They also have information to help you determine if your tree

can be saved or not at Urban and Community Forestry | CAN MY TREE BE SAVED? TFS

Some people may have experienced hail damage with leaves being knocked off trees. Most trees will bounce back by quickly putting out more leaves. However, look for damage on the stems and trunks of the trees, especially young trees. We do not recommend painting or any other type of dressing or treatment. Trees take care of their wounds quite efficiently. However, if your tree has experienced stress, whether it be from flood or drought, it more vulnerable to insects and disease.

## Texas Makes Significant Strides for Women's Health

New Data Show Increases in Clients Served

AUSTIN, TX – The Texas Health and Human Services Commission today released a new report showing significant strides in improving the reach of the state's core women's health programs, including a 30 percent increase in the number of women served in the Healthy Texas Women program. More than 270,000 Texans received women's health services in the Healthy Texas Women and Family Planning programs in fiscal year 2018.

The report, required by the Texas Legislature, outlines key successes in the agency's Healthy Texas Women and Family Planning programs, and also highlights several areas of improvements and goals for the programs going forward.

"We need to be champions for Texas women and their health. We're making progress, and we're not stopping," said Dr. Courtney N. Phillips, HHS executive commissioner, the first woman appointed to lead Texas Health and Human Services. "Our team is working to make sure women have access to the services they need, whether that's contraception, pregnancy testing or cancer screenings."

The Healthy Texas Women and Family Planning programs are the state's two core programs that specifically offer women's health and family planning services at no or low cost to eligible people in Texas. They increase access to women's health and family planning services to avert unintended pregnancies, positively affect the outcome of future pregnancies, and help improve the health and well-being of women and their families.

Key findings for the Healthy Texas Women program include:

Clients served: 172,023 (30 percent increase from previous year)

Estimated cost savings: \$136 million in federal and state dollars for 2018 to 2020

Key findings for the Family Planning program include:

Clients served: 106,224 (10 percent increase from previous year)

Estimated cost savings: \$74 million in federal and state dollars for 2018 to 2020

The anticipated cost savings is primarily due to averting unintended births that would have prompted Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program expenditures.

While significant strides have been made, state officials recognize improvements are needed to address service inequities and barriers to access, and to improve maternal health in Texas. HHSC is collaborating with stakeholders to continue evaluating ways to strengthen the program going

forward. Efforts are underway to improve provider outreach and provider look-up tools, evaluate continuity of care and better understand and address any access issues.

"Implementation of auto-enrollment to Healthy Texas Women is important for new mothers who are focusing on their family and may not have the time or energy to apply for another health care program," said Paula Turicchi, Vice President of Operations, Parkland Health & Hospital System, and former chair of the Texas Women's Health Advisory Committee. "Seamlessly continuing health care coverage after delivery helps maintain continuity of care for our patients at Parkland."

The City's Mosquito Surveillance and Response Plan is a comprehensive plan aimed at reducing the risk of illness due to West Nile virus. City personnel have made reducing mosquito breeding grounds a priority and are aggressively working to eliminate standing water in public drainage ditches. Water that cannot be eliminated is treated with

a biological mosquito larvicide (Bti). The City of Denton and the University of North Texas are also conducting routine surveys of adult mosquitoes. The collected mosquitoes will be identified and screened for the presence of viruses. While the City is working proactively to control mosquito populations and lower the threat of West Nile virus, citizen

involvement is essential.

"Mosquito control efforts in past seasons have been successful, which would not have been possible without the source reduction and larvicide efforts of Denton citizens," said Kenneth Banks, Utilities General Manager.

Eliminating breeding grounds is the most important

and effective mosquito prevention measure.

Help the City control Denton's mosquito population by eliminating standing water from these and other areas around your property.

- Open trash/recycling carts
- Boats and pool covers
- Fountains and bird baths
- Clogged rain gutters
- Low areas
- Water bowls for pets
- Buckets and barrels
- Flower pots and saucers
- Leaky hoses
- Wagons and other toys
- Ponds
- Neglected pools
- Tires
- Piles of trash or debris

The City of Denton Water Utilities Department has a limited supply of Bti briquettes that residents can pick up in limited quantities (two per resident) while the supply lasts. Residents will be required to show their driver's license or a current City of Denton utility bill to prove Denton residency.

"Eliminating standing water and application of larvicide are essential for successfully reducing mosquito populations, and Denton's residents play an important role in that effort," said Deborah Viera, Assistant Director of Environmental Services.

• Water Administration – Located at 901-A Texas St. in the Utility Service Center; Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

• City of Denton Composting – Located at 1100 S. Mayhill Rd. in the Pecan Creek Water Reclamation Facility; Tuesday through Saturday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

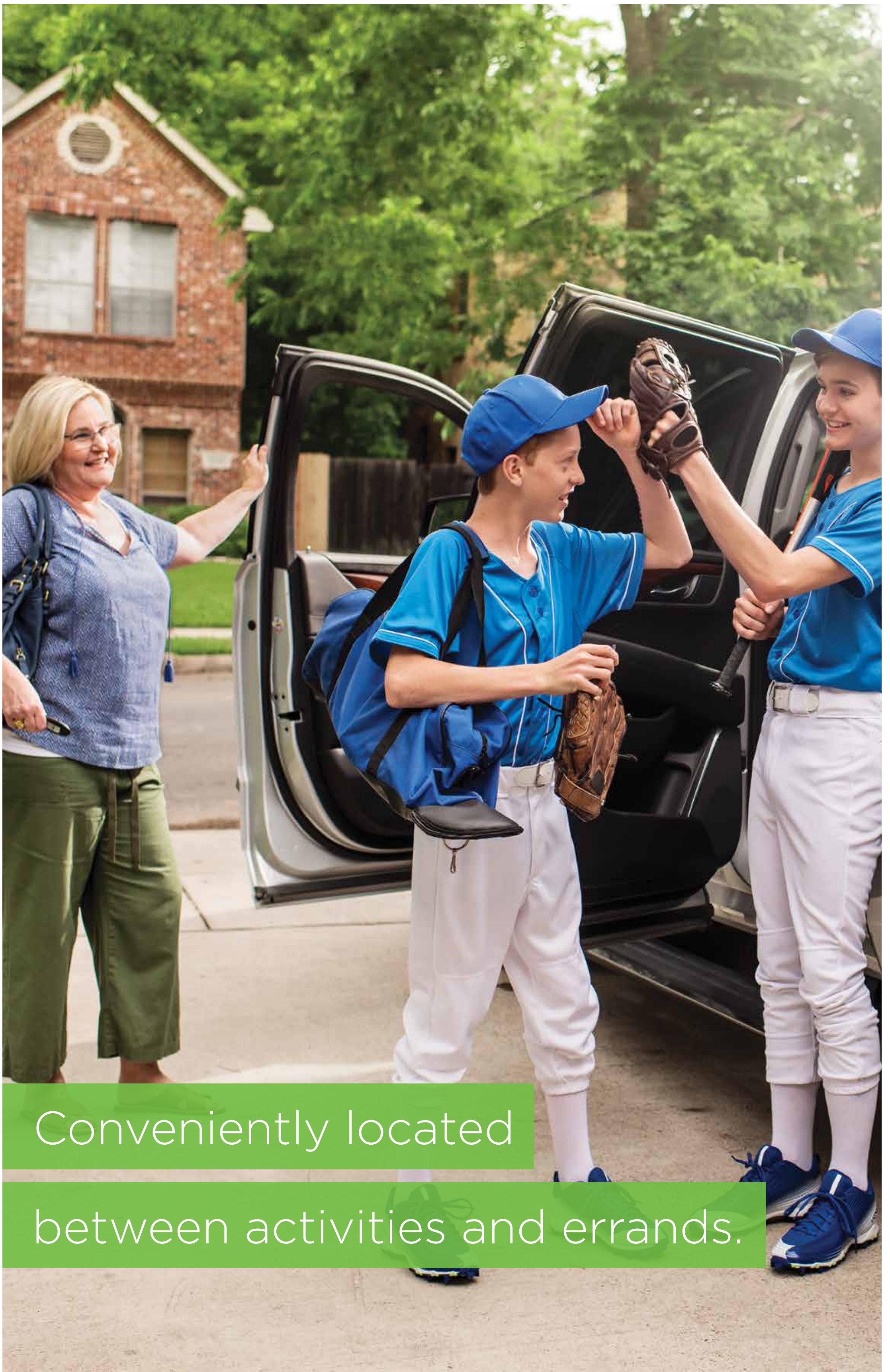
