

Share your new discoveries with us so we can enjoy them as well! No matter whatever you do this season, we hope it is filled with love, friends, family, and joy.



REMEMBERING OUR ANCESTORS ~ DÍA DE MUERTOS

Pan de muerto (Bread of the Dead), marigold flowers, pastel picado (colorful paper), and other festivities are quickly approaching once more this year.

Let's discuss Day of the Dead, or Día de Muertos in Spanish! It is a unique occasion for loved ones in the living world to reunite with departed family members is this festival. This major celebration is observed annually in several South American nations, but primarily in Mexico. In our area, the number of festivals and parades has increased due to its growing popularity in the United States.

The customary festival honors the life-death cycle and is held on November 1st and 2nd (but there are other events on October 31st and November 6th). However, cities will often celebrate on the weekend before the exact date.

The Denton Day of the Dead Festival will take place on East Hickory and Industrial Street in Downton from October 25 to October 27 this year. This is a public, family-friendly event. On October 26 from 2 to 10 p.m. is Dallas Dia Delos Muertos. The parade leaves Dallas City Hall at 7:00 p.m. The goal of these events is to strengthen and develop a welcoming community spirit.

Large parades and skull-themed face painting are common throughout the vibrant celebration. They are, however, intended to be a celebration and remembrance of friends and relatives who have departed into the afterlife rather than to be frightening.

Whether you are new to these traditions or grew up celebrating this holiday, we hope you mark your calendars for Day of the Dead this year.



RIDE AGAIN IN PILOT POINT

Clyde Barrow ride again in North Texas.

While the actual Bonnie & Clyde died in a hail of gunfire in rural Louisiana in the 1930s, Pilot Point comes together every year to commemorate the filming of the classic film starring Faye Dunaway and Warren Beatty. "Bonnie & Clyde", shot in 1966 in various locations around north Texas, filmed its famous bank

robbery scene in the Farmers and Merchants Bank on

very year, infamous outlaws Bonnie Parker and

the corner of Washington and Main.

This year's Bonnie & Clyde Days Festival, which recognizes the Academy Award-winning film shot right in the Historic Pilot Point Square, will be on October 12. From 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., this festival boasts activities for families, the Soap Box Challenge, live entertainment, plus the festival-favorite reenactments.

THE FILMING

Dunaway and Beatty were the leads in a star-studded cast that descended upon north Texas in the fall of 1966 for the filming of the movie, which also included appearances by Gene Hackman, Estelle Parsons (who won an Oscar for her portrayal of Blanche Barrow) and Gene Wilder.

An oft-repeated legend is that Bonnie & Clyde were frequently spotted in the Pilot Point area, but not to rob any banks. Clyde Barrow had relatives in the

area, who would offer safe haven to the Barrow Gang between their robberies.

2024 FESTIVAL

This year's Bonnie & Clyde Days will bring back the festival everyone knows and loves, while also taking it to the next level.

Headlining the slate of music for this year's festival will be Joey Green. The headlining set will begin at 6:30 pm on the main stage. They will cap off a

day filled with live entertainment, everything from dance troupes to other live music groups, including Trent Cowie, Hannah Hokit and Brian "Beerman" Houser.



We're very excited that the Ford Masonic Lodge has taken over the much-beloved Soap Box Challenge. Come up Washington Street towards the Library and check out the racers as they go for glory!

Festival attendees can expect the reenactment of the bank robbery scene, a free kids' zone, classic car show, including a stellar fleet of Model As, the Pie-Eating Contest and antique tractors.

THE BOB ALBRECHT WWI MEMORIAL

Located in Historic Pilot Point Square on the northwest side of the Gazebo.



FRANKLIN COLLEGE BELL

The original bell from Pilot Point Seminary School, which opened in 1872 as a primary and secondary school. The school started offering bachelor degrees in 1884 and officially changed its name to Franklin College in 1892. This was the earliest college in Denton County. The bell can be viewed at the Pilot Point Museum on the Historic Square.

THE HISTORIC SKINNER CEMETERY FROM 1858

To visit, turn off US 377 heading south on Debbie Lane for about one-third of a mile. You will find the cemetery on the north side of the road, canopied by giant oak trees.

From the early 1900's, located at 1156 North Highway 377 at the front of Pilot Point Feed's parking lot.





HISTORIC STABLES,THE LEGENDS, FORMALLY KNOWN AS MCQUAY STABLES

Located off of FM 922 and Ferguson Street in Tioga is the final resting place of two celebrated world famous horses. A Hall of Fame Stallion and a Ten Million Dollar Sire, Colonels Smoking Gun (Gunner), and legendary Hall of Fame Six Million Dollar Sire, Hollywood Dun It. Their resting site is visible from the highway.

Nuts For the Holidays?

Easy Maple Glazed Nuts

This easy-to-make, three-ingredient treat is perfect for all of the fall and winter holidays. Maple-glazed walnuts or pecans are delicious on a festive, warm winter salad, combined with Brussels sprouts, pumpkin, and cranberries. They can give any other salad the ideal crunch as well. Most people enjoy eating



them as a snack by the handful. When guests arrive for the holidays or on game days, it is simple to put this treat out on the table! Purchase cute holiday bags and distribute them as thoughtful gifts to coworkers, friends, and neighbors. Because of the delectable maple coating, these nuts can be combined with anything sweet or savory.

Here's what you'll need:

Pure maple syrup


Raw whole pecans or walnuts

Kosher Salt

Instructions:

Making sure you don't overcook the nuts is the only challenging part of this recipe for glazed nuts. Simmer one part maple syrup to four parts pecans or walnuts in a skillet for six to eight minutes, stirring occasionally. Cook maple syrup until it's almost completely absorbed; the nuts will start to group together. Avoid overcooking and remove the skillet from heat to avoid powdery sugar. Spread nuts on parchment paper to dry, and sprinkle with kosher salt. To enhance the salty sweetness of glazed nuts, add a little salt. On parchment paper, spread them out in a single layer to dry. If you're going to store them, wait until they've hardened for about 15 minutes. If you want to eat them right away, let them cool for five minutes.
